Middle School Pre-Mission Trip Devotionals

Everyone who is going on the mission trip is being required to write a short devotional. We will pray for the person who wrote the devotional that day and then text them that we prayed for them.

What you must include in your devotional:

- 1) **Scripture** (can be one verse, can be a whole chapter or something in between that length) (The passage needs to be typed out)
- 2) **Prayer** (you could write a prayer like, "God help me to understand your deep deep love for me and for all the people I come in contact with on the mission trip. Teach me to love others the way you love me", or give things to pray for like, "Pray that God would give you the heart of a servant, etc."
- 3) TWO or more of the following elements:
 - a) A personal story
 - b) Challenging Thoughts
 - c) Questions with space to write a response
 - d) Unpacking what your Bible passage means
 - e) A song
 - f) any other creative option you can think of.

This devotional does not have to be long. I would say keep it between a half page and a page.

At the top of the devotional please include:

- 1) a title (ex. "Loving Others," "For God's Glory," "God's Kingdom")
- 2) Your name
- 3) Your email address (not everyone has a cell phone). If you have a cell phone number, please include that too or one of the following: instagram, kik, or iMessage, as a way to reach you.

Ideas for devotionals:

Why are we going?/Service - how Jesus served, or what the Bible says about service Caring for/loving one another - how we can prepare to get along with each other Gift/abilities - discovering what God has gifted you to do as we serve, we are one body with many parts...romans 12

Prayer - ideas of how they can pray to prepare for the trip

Sacrifice - doing things for others rather than self

Having an Attitude of Gratitude on the trip

Who are we working for? (Doing things for God, not ourselves or for our glory)

If you have your own idea for a pre-trip devotional that is not listed, please feel free to do that.

Please email in **Microsoft Word, Mac Pages, Google Docs or the body of an email**. I usually have to do some editing, so **a PDF is not helpful**. PDF is helpful if also sending a Word file though.

Genesis 11 1-2 At one time, the whole Earth spoke the same language. It so happened that as they moved out of the east, they came upon a plain in the land of Shinar and settled down.

- 3 They said to one another, "Come, let's make bricks and fire them well." They used brick for stone and tar for mortar.

Just don't give up, because you never know what God is trying to tell you through that person.
