A NOTE FROM THE YOUTH PASTOR

Welcome to the Chicago 2019 Pre-Trip Devotional Packet. Each devotional is written by a mission trip participant (except the first 3 are written by Rachel, Samantha, and Hope Eriks who won't be attending the mission trip but were willing to still write a devotional. Please pray for them and message them too). It's so exciting to think that each person going on the trip has already started thinking and praying about the trip (by writing their devotional), and that each of us will be preparing for 23 days leading up to this trip! I expect God to bless this preparation in huge ways!

Instructions for using this devotional packet:

- 1. Read each devotional on the date at the top of each page.*
- 2. Pray for the person who wrote the devotional. Prayer tips:

That God would speak through these devotionals and prepare them for this trip.

That this trip would be an encouragement in their spiritual life.

That they would connect with God in deep ways during worship.

That they would give all of themselves to God in service.

That they would be an encouragement to others.

That they would see God in other people and tell them that.

That they would deepen their relationships with people in our youth group.

That they would develop, even more, a caring, compassionate heart for others.

That this trip would lead to life change after the trip.

That they would have SO much fun.

That they would keep a positive attitude and help others to stay positive too.

That they would understand God in a new way.

That God would speak to them through others.

That they would be willing to try new things.

That other people would enjoy their company.

That they would find times to connect with adult leaders.

For safety and good health.

That they would be hungry spiritually for God before, during, and after the trip.

3. Text/Email/Message the person who wrote the devotional, letting them know you prayed for them. This can be as simple as saying, "I prayed for you today" or you could write out what you actually prayed for them. (parents, its up to you if you want to text them)

*If you get behind in doing these devotionals, don't quit. Simply catch up, and text people, "Sorry, I got a little behind, but I prayed for you." Feel free to work ahead too if you will be gone on vacation and not have internet access. You need to do them all and message everyone before getting in the vans to leave on June 23.

If you haven't done the devotionals and messaged everyone by then, you will have to spend some time alone at the beginning of trip writing out prayers to the people you missed.

"The soothing tongue is a tree of life, but a perverse tongue crushes the spirit." -Proverbs 15:4



How often do we think about the words we say, the way in which we say those words, and how those words will affect others? Think of a balloon on a weighted string filled with helium, how it rises and stands tall, looking cheerful and happy. Our kind, encouraging, helpful words are like a freshly-filled balloon. Hopeful, encouraging words say to others, "I notice you. I value you. I care about you."



Have you ever said something you wish you could take back because of how you hurt someone? When we say, email, or text someone hurtful words, the Bible says we "crush the spirit." I know that I have hurt those closest to me with unkind words, and I have watched first-hand how I have played a part in crushing their spirit. I wish I could take those words back!

As we think about the upcoming mission trip to Chicago, let's ask God to help us use our words wisely to help build others up and give them encouragement, both on the mission trip and throughout our daily lives.

Challenge: Take 5 minutes to write a note of encouragement to someone in your life!

Prayer: Dear God, you are the God of grace and of hope. Thank you for creating each of us and for giving us a place in this world. Help us to honor you by speaking words that give hope and encouragement to those around us. When we fail and speak unkind words that "crush the spirit," help us to confess this to you and to seek forgiveness from those we have hurt by apologizing sincerely. When others hurt us with unkind words, God, help us to forgive them and still show love to them.



When Hope and I went on a Mission Trip to Mexico this winter, we saw things that we had never seen before. It was eye-opening. Poverty, faith, a community coming together are just some to share. It was an amazing experience and we ended each day with devotions at dinner to talk about our experiences. The theme for these devotions was faith (and sharing it with others). On Sunday (the first official day) we made a bracelet. The bracelet had six beads on it and represented the key aspects of our faith.



Every day, we wore these bracelets as a way

to have a conversation starter about our faith. It wasn't complicated, it was easy to explain. The story of the bracelet went like this:

Blue (Oceans and Skies): God created the World and it was good

Black: Sin entered the world

Red: God sent his Son into the World and covered up the sin

White: We are now saved

Green: We have a green light to GO and tell people about Jesus

Yellow: We will spend eternity with our savior

In the Bible, there are many examples of people sharing their faith but I think sometimes we find it hard to strike up a conversation... (I know I do) How do we tell our peers about Jesus? What should we say? How will people react? This is the blessing mission trips give us, the opportunity to share our faith. We have such incredible news to share, and we need to tell people.

On the final day of the trip to Mexico, we (Hope, my cousin and I) were able to share the story of these bracelets with the kids who we built the house for. It was a great experience and I know those kids will treasure the bracelets they got but they will also treasure the story. I treasure the bracelet I have because it reminds me....

Sharing our faith does not have to be COMPLICATED, It's a blessing we know about Jesus and can share it with others.

Titus 3:1-2 (MSG) Remind the people to respect the government and be law-abiding, always ready to lend a helping hand. No insults, no fights. God's people should be bighearted and courteous.

There are 4 big things being pointed out in these verses.

- 1) We should be law-abiding and respect our government, even if we don't agree.
 - a. Romans 13 talks about submitting to all governing authorities, because all authority comes from God. God placed people in authority for a reason, and it isn't for us to know that reason, but we should still submit to, and follow the laws given. This also means you should listen to and follow your parents' rules, since they are a governing authority over you.
- 2) We should always be ready to help someone in need.
 - a. Remember that the point of our trip is to help others.
- 3) We should hold our tongues and our fists from others.
 - a. Our words and actions should build people up, not tear them down. You never know what someone is going through and what hope they may find in kind words and actions, but hurtful words will always bring pain.
- 4) We should be kind and show mercy to everyone
 - a. The New Living Translation puts it like this. "Instead, they should be gentle and show true humility to everyone." We will be meeting people on our trip that come from a very different place than you and me. You may meet kids that only have 1 parent, or a kid that has no parents at all. You may meet someone who is homeless and living on the street. Our job is to meet people where they are, to be kind and show them love.

On my second trip as a youth leader we went to Toronto, Canada. We used the same organization for that trip (Center For Student Missions), so it was nearly identical to the Chicago trip. One of our evenings we went out into the city and they brought us to shores of Lake Ontario. There we met a homeless man that many of the CSM groups meet, and he told us his story. He lived a pretty normal life, had a house, I think he even had a wife at one point. Then he lost his job, lost his house, and ended up on the street. He didn't do anything wrong to lose his job, it was just gone. He tried to pay his bills, he just couldn't. And now he goes from shelter to shelter or sleeps outside. Many of us think of homeless people as either lazy people or people who have made bad choices and ended up on the street. After I heard his story, it hit me that I had been judging people without knowing anything about them. It is still a challenge for me to not judge someone based on look alone, and it is something I don't want any of us to do while in Chicago, because we have no clue what someone else's story is until we ask.

Pray for the people we will meet on our trip. Pray that they will feel loved and not judged. Pray that we find many words of encouragement for everyone else on the trip, and that we don't get on each other's nerves or bicker. Pray for those you submit to (parents, teachers, youth group leaders, police, politicians), that they listen to what God is calling them to do and that they also submit to Him.

Dikaiosune

Scripture:

Matthew 5:6

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness for they will be filled." (The words of Jesus)

Thoughts:

When the Bible gets translated from it's original language, we, as English speaking people, often miss what is really being said. In this passage, the word for "righteousness" is the Greek word dikaiosune (pronounced dih-ky-oh-SUE-nay). While this is an accurate translation, there is more to this word. It also is talking about God's just rule, or God's justice. This is the same word thats used in Matthew 6:33, "But seek first his kingdom and his dikaiosune, and all these things will be given to you as well." When we hear righteousness, we tend to think of living right or being good. But what if we thought of righteousness as more than "right living" and more of a heart for justice (God's kingdom meeting the spiritual, emotional, social, and physical needs of others)?

This passage also starts with hungering and thirsting. Think of a time you've been extremely hungry or thirsty. Maybe you ran a 5k for cross country at an away meet and you forgot your water bottle. Maybe you had to do homework or had a meeting during lunch period and had no lunch or snacks until you got home. Maybe you played mid-field at your soccer game and ran the length of the field what seems like a hundred times and you get home and there is "nothing to eat." In these moments there's somewhat of a sense of desperation to quench our hunger and thirst. We ache and long for food and water. We simply need it and will do whatever it takes to get what we need.

What if we long for God's kingdom to meet the spiritual, emotional, social, and physical needs of others in this same way? What if we will do whatever it takes to have these needs met in others?

My hope for every mission trip, is that our eyes are open to the injustices of the world, and that we want to see God's kingdom bring about justice - through us and others. So, on this trip, may we long for right living and justice for us and the people we meet. And may we go home after this trip with a hunger and thirst for *dikaiosune* and do whatever it takes to quench it.

Prayer:

God, give us a heart like yours. Give us a hunger and thirst for right living and justice. And as we hunger and thirst for it, may we be filled. May you use us and the organizations we partner with to bring right living and justice to the city we serve in and back home.
